ABOVE BOARD



The origins of his phrase relate to Pirates. A Pirate ship hid the bulk of the men below deck, (Below Board) in order to look innocent to the merchant ships they intended to pillage. Also, early merchants' ships would hide their illegal cargo below the ships dec. Legal cargo would be placed in plain sight on the deck or above board. So, the term above board means everything is O.K.




ALOOF

dangerous.





## **ORYC Recipe Corner**

#### Watermelon Feta Salad

- ¼ cup extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tbsp red wine vinegar
- ½ tsp kosher salt
- 3 cups cubed seedless watermelon
- 1 cup crumbled feta
- 1 cup finely chopped cucumbers
- ½ cup coarsely chopped fresh mint plus more for serving
- ½ cup thinly slice red onion
- flaky sea salt (optional)

- 1. In a small bowl, whisk oil, vinegar, and kosher salt.

  Add watermelon, feta, cucumber, mint, and onion and toss to coat.
- 2. Top with more mint and sea salt if desired

#### **Poolside Popsicle Spritzers**

- 1½ cups pineapple juice
- ½ cup mango juice or nectar
- 2 oz. vodka
- 1 lime, thinly sliced into rounds
- 1 (750 mL) bottle of sparkling white rose or orange wine
- Club soda for serving

- 1. In a medium bowl or measuring cup, stir pineapple juice, mango juice and vodka
- 2. Place 1 to 2 lime slices into 6 popsicle molds. Carefully fill each mold with pineapple juice mixture. Cover and insert sticks. Freeze until solid, at least 4 hours or up to overnight
- 3. Pour 4 oz. sparkling wine into 6 wine glasses. Top with splash of club soda. Place popsicle into glass and serve.
